Anzac Day, 25th April 2021

Last Monday, 19th April, the Prime Minister, Scott Morrison, announced a Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide. This announcement, some days before the national commemoration of Anzac Day, is welcome news, primarily to those families who have suffered the loss of loved ones due to suicide associated with defence service. The Prime Minister said:

"The death of any Australian Defence Force member or veteran is one death too many and a tragedy that is deeply felt by all Australians. Tragically, and heartbreakingly, this includes death by suicide. Recognising this, the Government will take the step of recommending to the Governor-General the establishment of a Royal Commission into Defence and Veterans Suicide, following a period of consultation on draft Terms of Reference, with the relevant community and state and territory governments. Suicide prevention is a key priority for the Federal Government. We have always recognised that the rate of suicide of Australian Defence Force members and veterans is unacceptably high. In recognising the sacrifices made by our serving and former members and their families on behalf of the nation, we owe it to members, veterans and their families to continue to take action."

For people of faith, now joyfully celebrating the Risen Jesus, who conquered death once and for all (Rom 6:9), death is met with courage and faith as well as grief, sorrow and sometimes anger. From the earliest times, Christians have not run away from death but have faced it head on. This in turn has shaped our funeral liturgies over the centuries praying for the deceased that God will be merciful in judgement and that those who mourn are consoled by the grace of God's loving embrace. Although suicide, however it comes about, is more confronting and in many ways inexplicable, it exposes another layer of grief and bewilderment if it is associated with defence service personnel, each one being willing to make the ultimate sacrifice: death in defence of one's country.

As a community of faith, we should pray for those serving or veteran defence personnel who have suicided, for their families and friends, and for the success of the Royal Commission. We pray that, among other achievements, it will help bring healing to hurting families.


I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me. **Alleluia!**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
