

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

WELCOME BACK TO MASS: There was always going to be an end to lockdown. The question we all had, was when? So, we've finally arrived. We began weekday Masses last Wednesday following the opening up day last Monday, 18th October. We are all used to the following rules which were in place previously: masks are compulsory for all those aged over twelve, unless there is a medical reason to be exempted; the QR Code or signing in still has to be followed; and the 4sqm rule still applies. This means we can take a maximum of 70 persons in the church for Mass. We will continue live-streaming one Sunday Mass each week for those who are unable for whatever reason to be with us at church. The live-streamed Mass will be the 5:30pm Vigil most of the time. For a number of reasons, we cannot guarantee that the Mass will be live-streamed each week. The live-streamed Mass is then put onto our parish website, so it can be viewed later. Let us pray for each other and those especially who have died in the course of the pandemic. ~ Fr. "TAP & GO" DONATION POINT: The opportunity is now available for parishioners and visitors to donate to St. Patrick's Parish using a credit or debit card. The majority of parishes in the Diocese now have this facility. Following advice from both the Parish Pastoral Council and the Finance Committee to install this new donation point, it will be available for use at the weekend Masses, at least initially. The donation is pre-programmed for \$5.00 per tap of the card over the tap symbol. If you wish to donate more than \$5.00, tap again. It takes a few seconds to record your donation. The Diocese's encouragement to use this facility is a response to the trend where most people carry little if any cash these days. Also, in these COVID-19 safe times, there is no handling of cash. The donation point does not take the place of the First and Second collections or the weekly envelope offerings which will, until COVID-19 restrictions are relaxed, still be in the bowls placed on the organ at the front of the Church. Without this program, many vulnerable mothers like Churai will have nowhere to turn when they need love and care the most.


