1ST READING: ISAIAH 43:16-21

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Philippians

For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won.

All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.



A reading from the holy gospel according to John

LENTEN DISCIPLINE AND PENANCE: The parish offers numerous ways of fulfilling our Lenten discipline and penance. During Lent, we should give priority to ensuring we fulfil our Sunday obligation by being at Mass. We can attend weekday Masses Wednesday to Friday. Fridays this Season of Lent will have a Lenten discipline in that Eucharistic Adoration will be held in the mornings (9:45am-10:45am) and in the evening Stations of the Cross at 6:30pm. We can keep in mind the classic response to Lent with extra prayer, almsgiving and fasting (Mt 6:1-6, 16-18). Project Compassion is a perfect way to forgo some pleasures and donate over the weeks of Lent. Boxes and Envelopes are available at the back of the Church. This year's theme is "For All Future Generations" (Gen 9:12). Money donated is being directed to projects in Australia, India, Solomon Islands, Democratic Republic of Congo and Mozambique. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. Fasting binds those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year; the law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. Catholics are obliged to receive holy communion at least once a year between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday.
