It might feel like a bit of a marathon, but the 40 days of Lent is now over. For Lent we were encouraged to review and reform our lives by means of fasting, acts of charity and prayer (Mt 6:1-18). The parish provided us with ways of doing these things: daily Mass, Stations of the Cross on Friday, Eucharistic Adoration, First Rite of Penance (individual confession), Project Compassion and our various specialist ministries. Then there were the various private disciplines we chose to do during our long Lenten retreat.

Now, during this Easter season, we rightly rejoice and celebrate. We rejoice that our relationship with the Risen Christ has been deepened. We rejoice that our faith has been strengthened. We celebrate that we are no longer the fearful Peter who denied Jesus three times, but the faith-filled, joyous and strong Peter. His witness to the Risen Christ (Ac 2:14-41) brought about the healing and salvation of many people in those very early times of the newborn Church.

The Easter ceremonies are beautiful acts of worship glorifying and praising God as we celebrate the mysteries of our salvation. Such rituals have to be planned and rehearsed to assist us in praying well. The organists and choir members have been practising for weeks now. I thank them for their generosity. There are others involved in church cleaning, preparing the altar, arranging flowers, organising palms for Palm Sunday, making sure all the ceremonies are planned and provided for with the necessary materials. Readers, acolytes and servers make themselves available. Those who organise and are personally involved in the Good Friday Stations of the Cross help us to express our faith in dramatic ways. To all these people and quite a few others, on behalf of all the parishioners, my sincere gratitude. Together with Fr. Treesen and Sr. Helen we wish you all, your families and riends, a blessed and happy Easter.



LITURGY OF THE WORD EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD – YEAR B



1ST READING: ACTS 10:34, 37-43A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.' Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 117:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

Response: This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end. Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.' **R.**

The Lord's right hand has triumphed; his right hand raised me up. I shall not die, I shall live and recount his deeds. **R.**

2ND READING: COLOSSIANS 3:1-4

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Colossians

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise. The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended! Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: he goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious king, thy mercy show!

Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. **Alleluia!**


THE GOSPEL: JOHN 20:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
