Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, he sent the disciples, saving, 'Go into the village opposite, where on entering you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat; untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" you shall say this, "The Lord has need of it". So those who were sent went away and found it as he had told them. And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' And they said, 'The Lord has need of it'. And they brought it to Jesus, and throwing their garments on the colt they set Jesus upon it. And as he rode along, they spread their garments on the road. **GOOD FRIDAY CELEBRATIONS - 19 APRIL:** We would like to invite parishioners of all ages to join in "**The Way of the Cross**" held on Good Friday at 10:00am. If you would like to participate on Good Friday, please meet behind the Church in the school grounds by 8:00am to organise and to help set up for the celebration. Your support ensures the success of this ceremony.

**ANNUAL GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION - 19 APRIL:** The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land takes place on Good Friday. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from the Good Friday collection. The collection is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Last year, Australian Catholics donated \$1.4 million to this cause, despite tough economic times, rural droughts and increasing cost of living which put a strain on family budgets and financial resources. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land again on this Good Friday. Please also pray that peace and harmony will become a reality in the birthplace of Jesus, the 'Prince of Peace'.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** This coming Tuesday (16 April 2019), after the 7:30pm Mass, will be the final praying of the Stations of the Cross. Lent ends and the Triduum begins on Thursday evening, 7:30pm with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. Let us pray for our Church and world during this holy time.

THE EASTER TRIDUUM: The Easter Triduum takes its meaning from the Latin word for three. The Easter Triduum celebrates three events in the life of Jesus the Last Supper, Jesus dying on the cross and his rising from the dead. These events are not separated - they form one long day. The Triduum opens with the Mass of the Lord's Supper and concludes at Easter. It is good to take time to reflect on these events. There will be an opportunity to reflect together on the Triduum. When: Tuesday, 16 April at 6:00pm [before the 7:30pm Mass]. Where: Parish Office. This time of reflection together is a way of preparing us to enter more fully into the mystery of the dying and rising of Jesus. Let us continue to pray for one another as we enter into this holy time.
