# easter surday

One of the themes of Lent was that we are on a journey from sin to sanctity, from darkness to light and from captivity to freedom in the Lord. From the early Church until now, the baptised have put this into action by "going on pilgrimage". It is a practical (and sometimes physically and spiritually challenging) way to come closer to God and perhaps glimpse the divine by visiting Holy Places, such as the Holy Land, Rome, Assisi, and the numerous Marian sites around the world. Over the past few decades the *Camino* (path, way) has become very popular. The Camino de Santiago, known in English as the Way of Saint James is a network of pilgrims' ways leading to the shrine of the apostle Saint James the Great in the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galicia in northwestern Spain, where tradition has it that the remains of the saint are buried. Many follow its routes as a form of retreat for their spiritual growth.

Pope Benedict XVI said that "To go on pilgrimage is not simply to visit a place to admire its treasures of nature, art or history. To go on pilgrimage really means to step out of ourselves in order to encounter God where he has revealed himself, where his grace has shone with particular splendour and produced rich fruits of conversion and holiness among those who believe. Above all, Christians go on pilgrimage to the Holy Land, to the places associated with the Lord's passion, death and resurrection." (November 2010).

A humble form of pilgrimage took place in the Diocese of Parramatta on Good Friday night and into the early hours of Holy Saturday. It was estimated that more than 1,500 pilgrims, mostly young people, were expected to take part in the Good Friday night walk through Parramatta Diocese. The walk began at 10:00pm and ended at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Parramatta. The focus of the 20km walk was a reflection on the Stations of the Cross within a contemporary context. Apart from the usual route from Blacktown parish, our parish was asked to host the beginning of a new route which will journey through Holy Family Parish, East Granville, Holy Trinity Parish, Granville, St. Margaret Mary's Parish, Merrylands and St. Oliver Plunkett's Parish, Harris Park to arrive at St. Patrick's Cathedral. Congratulations to all those young (and not so young) who took part in this pilgrimage. We will be on our own Easter journey now as we explore, reflect on and pray about how the early Church proclaimed the greatest message ever heard: 'There is no need for you to be afraid. I know you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said he would' (Mt 28:6). Happy Easter to all. ~ *Fr. Peter Blayney*

## 1ST READING: ACTS 10:34, 37-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.' Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

#### THE GOSPEL: LUKE 24:1-12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

On the first day of the week, at the first sign of dawn, the women went to the tomb with the spices they had prepared. They found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb, but on entering discovered that the body of the Lord Jesus was not there. As they stood there not knowing what to think, two men in brilliant clothes suddenly appeared at their side. Terrified, the women lowered their eyes. But the two men said to them, 'Why look among the dead for someone who is alive? He is not here; he is risen. Remember what he told you when he was still in Galilee: that the Son of Man had to be handed over into the power of sinful men and be crucified, and rise again on the third day?' And they remembered his words.

When the women returned from the tomb they told all this to the Eleven and to all the others. The women were Mary of Magdala, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James. The other women with them also told the apostles, but this story of theirs seemed pure nonsense, and they did not believe them.

Peter, however, went running to the tomb. He bent down and saw the binding cloths, but nothing else; he then went back home, amazed at what had happened.
