

LITURGY OF THE WORD

20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR C



1ST READING: JEREMIAH 38:4-6, 8-10

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank.

Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said, 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.' At this the king gave Ebed-melech the Cushite the following order: 'Take three men with you from here and pull the prophet Jeremiah out of the well before he dies.'

STAND FOR LIFE RALLY AGAINST PROPOSED ABORTION LAWS:

The NSW Parliament is about to legislate for abortion on demand till birth, one of the most extreme abortion laws in the world. The Bill was pushed through the Legislative Assembly and will be debated in the Legislative Council from Tuesday, 20 August.

Join us in peaceful protest against this radical proposed legislation.

Under this Bill:

Children can be aborted for any reason right up till the final moments of a pregnancy; Amendments to protect children who survive botched abortion attempts were defeated; There are no safeguards to prevent targeted abortion based on gender or disability; Doctors and medical staff are compelled to participate (by referral) in the taking of an innocent life.

This Bill was ambushed in Parliament, with no consultation, in an attempt to curb community backlash.

This is our last opportunity to fight against this extremist Bill.
