CORONAVIRUS

As we know, the virus is gaining momentum and the World Health Organization has now declared a public health emergency. As a result of this declaration and also advice from the NSW Department of Health, Bishop Vincent Long van Nguyen OFM Conv, Bishop of Parramatta, has issued the following directives in the celebration of Mass in the Diocese until further notice:

- 1. In those parishes and communities in the Diocese where Holy Communion is distributed in Both Kinds, this practice will cease. Communion of the Precious Blood will be for the celebrant only.
- 2. For the time being priests/deacons are not to invite parishioners to exchange the Greeting of Peace.
- 3. All ministers of Holy Communion (both Ordinary and Extraordinary) are to use hand sanitizers before the distribution of Holy Communion commences.


THE GOSPEL: MATTHEW 5:13-16

PARISH NOTICES

CHANGES TO MASS SCHEDULES: Last November proposed changes to the times of the Saturday Vigil Mass and Tuesday evening Mass were suggested. The reason was that a number of parishioners had suggested these changes, namely, that the Vigil Mass be moved forward to 5:30pm and the Tuesday evening Mass be moved forward to 7:00pm. Quite a few parishioners responded with most supporting the Vigil Mass change and everyone who contacted me in favour of the 7:00pm new time. A minority spoke against the change to the Vigil Mass time being moved. The reason is that this minority often work on Saturdays and find the 6:00pm time fits in well with work. It is likely that if the Mass were at 5:30pm they could not get to Mass. For the sake of the minority view, I think the best thing is to leave the Vigil Mass at 6:00pm. As there were no objections to moving the Tuesday night Mass forward to 7:00pm, the Mass will now be at 7:00pm and not 7:30pm.
