THE GOSPEL: MATTHEW 22:1-14

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited," he said, "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He dispatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. LIVE-STREAMING SUNDAY MASS will begin on the weekend of $17^{th}/18^{th}$ October. The Mass to be live-streamed will be the 5:30pm Vigil Mass. This can be viewed in real time or later as the Mass will remain on the website for some days. This means that the last pre-recorded Sunday Mass will be for this coming weekend, 10th/11th October. As the number of Coronavirus cases in the community appears to be declining, parishioners might consider returning to the Church for Mass. The Vigil Mass is attracting the most people while the Sunday mornings at 8:00am and 10:00am have fewer. If you wish to attend Sunday Mass in the Church, you must contact the Parish Office either by phone or email, indicating which Mass you wish to attend, your name and contact number. The Church's capacity is 70 persons. The 4sqm rule is still in place so this has to be observed. There are many reasons why some people might be reluctant to return to church in person. This is quite understandable. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday given by the Bishop at the beginning of the ~ Fr. Peter Blayney pandemic still applies.
